    they are selling popcorn, snacks and water. We will be helping with sales and overseeing the student volunteers.
  - We had our first official Celebrate Cleveland planning meeting we have not signed the contract as of yet, but we are planning for Friday, May 19th at Michelle's Ballroom on Belmont and California. There will be free parking and potentially a staff only cocktail reception before the event. We have a walk thru at the venue next Friday. We are looking for volunteers to help with the event to procure food donations for the strolling dinner buffet, beer, wine, liquor, as well as silent auction items (restaurant gift cards, theater tickets, sporting event tickets, hotel stays, unique items, etc).
  - We will have another Bingo event on Thursday February 23th, 5:30-7pm.
  - On Saturday, February 25th will be hosting our first pre-school community event (targeted at ages 5 and under). - O Competency A- Champions teacher and staff excellence through a focus on continuous improvement in development to develop and achieve the vision of high expectations for all students.
  - Meet with the Construction team on Tuesday. The windows are almost complete. The south basement and the gym have been painted. The plan is to have the shades installed over spring break.
  - Meet with the Mobile Construction team. The project is out for bid. The plan is for new flooring, windows, and reconfiguration of the bathrooms.
